



The problem...


•\$213 Billion could be saved by assuring the proper use of medications

•\$105 Billion from addressing non-adherence ALONE


•64% of PA's primary care needs were able to be met by physicians

Wisconsin

- Wisconsin Pharmacy Quality Collaborative (WPQC) started in 2007
- More than 36,000 members have received services (1,200 have received CMRs)
- More than 1,200 pharmacists, 500 technicians, and 300 pharmacy students trained and certified
- Pharmacist payment for services:
 - \$30-intervention-based services
 - \$10-3 month supply changes
 - \$75-initial CMR
 - \$35-quarterly CMR follow-up


Minnesota

- •UPlan MTM network
- •39,000 University of Minnesota employee members
- •6,000 state employees with diabetes
- •165 pharmacists as of May 2013
- CPT code billing based on level of service and complexity
- •Pay for performance bonus based on five diabetes treatment (D5) goals

North Carolina

- Community Care of North Carolina (CCNC)
- Physician-led community organization that cares for NC Medicaid patients
- Team-based approach
- •Awarded a 3-year \$15 million CMS CMMI Healthcare Innovation Award to demonstrate community pharmacy's role in cutting costs
- Currently 72 pharmacies in the network
- •"Do you want to be paid more, or do you want to be paid differently?"-Joe Moose, PharmD

2015 Part D MTM Requirements

Targeted beneficiaries have:

- 1. A maximum of at least 3 chronic diseases.
- 2. A maximum of at least 8 Part D medications
- 3. An annual Part D drug spend of at least \$3,138

At least 1 annual Comprehensive Medication Review

At least quarterly Targeted Medication Reviews

Benefits of MTM

Improved outcomes

Improved quality of care

Reduced total cost of healthcare (increased drug costs)

Patient focused, not product focused

Issues with MTM

Incentives are not aligned amongst stakeholders




Pennsylvania

- Training developed through a grant with collaboration with all seven schools of pharmacy
- •Steering group with pharmacists in varying practice settings and locations


Mission:

The Pennsylvania Pharmacist Care Network (PPCN) will be the structure for pharmacists in the Commonwealth to work together to care for individuals' medication-related needs in local communities. The goals of the PPCN are to:
