




Nonmedical Use of Pain Relievers in the Past Year among Individuals Aged 12 or Older




Nonmedical Use of Pain Relievers in the Past Year among Individuals Aged 12 to 17




Nonmedical Use of Pain Relievers in the Past Year among Individuals Aged 18 to 25




Nonmedical Use of Pain Relievers in the Past Year among Individuals Aged 26 or older




Needing But Not Receiving Treatment for Illicit Drug Use in the Past Year among Individuals Aged 12 or Older





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Act 139

Amended the PA Controlled Substance, Drug, Device, and Cosmetic Act

- First responder administration of naloxone under protocol
- Third party prescribing of naloxone
- "Good Samaritan" provision

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Naloxone

Approved for the treatment of opioid overdose and reversal

Mechanism of Action:

Competitive opioid antagonist

□ Reverses opioid effects in the brain within minutes

How supplied

- 1. Intramuscular injection
 - 1. Vial and syringe
 - 2. Auto injector
- 2. Intranasal spray

Intramuscular Injection-Vial

- ■10x1ml vial
 - \square 0.4mg/ml
 - □1mg/ml



- Inject 0.4-4mg IM.
 - ■May repeat every 2-3 minutes as needed
 - □Do not exceed 10mg (0.01mg/kg)
 - □0.4mg doses are more commonly recommended

Intramuscular Injection-Auto injector

- Evsio®
- Delivers 0.4mg dose
 - ■May repeat every
 - 2-3 minutes as needed

Visual and auditory instructions

Counseling Points

- Know the signs/symptoms of drug overdose
- Call 911 immediately
- Prepare naloxone
 - ☐ Injection:
 - Remove cap from naloxone and unsheathe needle
 - Insert needle into rubber stopper and hold upside down
 - Draw back 1cc (1 ml) into the syringe
 - Inject into the shoulder or thigh
 - Repeat in 3 minutes if needed
 - ☐ Auto injector:
 - Follow instructions on package as well as audio instructions

Are they breathing?

- Signs of an overdose:
- Slow or shallow breathing
- · Gasping for air when sleeping or weird snoring
- Pale or bluish skin
- Slow heartbeat, low blood pressure
- · Won't wake up or respond (rub knuckles on sternum)



Call 911 for help

"Someone is unresponsive and not breathing." Give clear address and location.



Airway

Make sure nothing is inside the person's mouth.



Rescue breathing Oxygen saves lives. Breathe for them

One hand on chin, tilt head back, pinch nose closed. Make a seal over mouth & breathe in 1 breath every 5 seconds Chest should rise, not stomach



Evaluate

Are they any better? Can you get naloxone and prepare it quickly enough that they won't go for too long without your breathing assistance?



Prepare naloxone

- . Insert needle through rubber plug, with bottle upside down
- · Pull back on plunger and take up 1 cc into the syringe
- Don't worry about air bubbles (they aren't dangerous in muscle injections)



Muscular injection nject 1cc of naloxone into a big muscle (shoulder or thigh)

Only take medicine

prescribed to you

· Don't take more than

instructed · Call a doctor if

your pain gets worse

· Never mix pain meds

with alcohol

· Avoid sleeping pills

when taking pain meds · Dispose of unused

medications

· Store your medicine

in a secure place

· Learn how to use

naloxone

· Teach your family +

friends how to respond

to an overdose

Evaluate + support · Continue rescue breathing

- Give another shot of naloxone in 3 minutes if no or minimal breathing or responsiveness
- Naloxone wears off in 30-90 minutes
- Comfort them: withdrawal can be unpleasant.
- Get them medical care and help them not use more opiate right away
- . Encourage survivors to seek treatment if they feel they have a problem

- Pre-filled 2mg/2ml cartridge
- Nose piece sold separately




Counseling Points

- Know the signs/symptoms of drug overdose
- Call 911 immediately
- Preparation and Administration
 - □Pull off yellow and red caps of the plastic tube and naloxone
 - ☐Screw nose piece unto the plastic tube
 - □Screw naloxone into the tube/nose piece assembly
 - ☐Give a short, strong push
 - ☐ Half of the container in each nostril
 - □Repeat in 3 minutes if needed







- III. Granting immunity under the "Good Samaritan" provision


